As 2025 comes to a close, we reflect on the inspiring accomplishments of our adult learners. Every day, we see how education transforms lives—not just through diplomas or certificates, but by helping individuals rediscover purpose, confidence, and hope.

This **Season of Giving**, we'd like to share Nicholas' story with you—a powerful reminder of why your support matters.

Nicholas is 46. For most of his life, he believed he didn't need a high school diploma. He had steady work, multiple jobs, and made a decent living. But over time, opportunities slipped away, and he began turning to alcohol to cope. When he applied for a full-time position two years ago, he was denied — not for lack of skill, but because he couldn't provide proof of high school graduation. That moment stayed with him.

It was then that Nicholas decided it was time to rebuild his life, turning years of challenges into new momentum for his future. He entered a rehabilitation program and enrolled in our High School Equivalency program. With support from his recovery program and the caring community at TLC, he has maintained eight months of sobriety and steadily regained his confidence and focus. Although returning to school for the first time in nearly three decades felt daunting, Nicholas stayed committed to a simple motto that guided his progress: *Just get there and do it*.

His commitment paid off. In October, Nicholas earned his High School Equivalency Diploma — a goal he once feared was out of reach. Now, he's stepping into the next chapter of his journey and plans to learn a trade that can open the door to a brighter, more stable future.

When asked what makes The Learning Center different, Nicholas didn't hesitate to say:

"Here, people care. At other schools you can feel lost — but at The Learning Center, someone always checks in. They help you believe you can do this."

Nicholas' success is inspiring, and it is possible because of friends like you. That is why we have launched our **2025 Year-End Campaign to raise \$30,000 by December 31**st. Every dollar you give helps provide the support network that makes learning possible for adults who have faced barriers for most of their lives.

We are excited to begin a new partnership with Dominican University's Chicago Campus. This collaboration strengthens our ongoing efforts to connect students with high-quality workforce training programs that open doors to stable careers, greater financial independence, and long-term growth.

As part of this new partnership, we welcomed a representative from Dominican University who met with current students and recent graduates to share information about two certified Workforce Development programs: Basic Nurse Assistant Training Program and Cybersecurity Program. Both are 8-week courses that lead to professional certification, giving students an accessible and realistic pathway into high-demand fields.

We look forward to continuing this partnership and bringing more opportunities like this to our students, ensuring they have the tools, guidance, and confidence to pursue careers that can truly transform their lives.
